In Academic year 2016-2017 it has two bilateral agreements and the third will be provided. The Fundamental strategy is to be the first stage connects to institution's in neighbouring countries such as Austria, Italy, Germany and Croatia. In preparation is also an agreement with a university in the UK, where were studied our lecturers. PHYSIOTHERAPEUTICA intends to become a more active member of the Ceepus network. Throughout the project Leonardo Da Vinci Programme Euro skill will enable students to have a practice abroad.

The purpose of cooperation with foreign institutions is a joint design and implementation of scientific projects, study programs, exchange of teachers, researchers and other staff, student exchange, exchange of scientific and technical publications, scientific information, participation in scientific meetings, symposia and conferences, and the implementation of other higher activities.

Cooperation with foreign institutions allows the development of education in the institution follows modern European trends and recommendations, the creation of courses on offer is tailored to offer similar institutions abroad and in particular the needs of employers-both domestic and foreign, which allows graduates to compete for jobs on the international labour market.

The Erasmus Mobility Program will be vital for Physiotherapeutica to achieve the high quality student placement. Almost all undergraduates and short cycle students at Physiotherapeutica have to participate in a training period (at hospitals, research institutions and Health Spa resorts) to receive their degrees. The training period is a compulsory part of the curriculum. Our students attend their training courses in the firms or institutions closely related to their subjects. The agreements are signed between the training institution and our institution before the training period starts. The work - program is determined by both parties, and monitored by the department coordinator. Evaluation is carried out both by the institution and by the coordinator representing the Physiotherapeutica. Since the placement is a part of the curriculum, full recognition is given, when it is over. A cooperation in the framework of the Erasmus + Programme will enable to the Physiotherapeutica to get more agreements with some European Universities and institutions and has taken the necessary measures to achieve a high standard in the placement program.

Participation in Erasmus+ programme will accelerate international cooperation and enable addition to stuff and student's mobility also an active involvement in bi and multilateral cooperation (e.g. research projects, lifelong learning programmes, projects with firms etc.) will help to increase not only the number of stakeholders attracted to the Physiotherapeutica but also the quality of the education because such international programmes spark competition among students and staff, motivating them to work harder.
